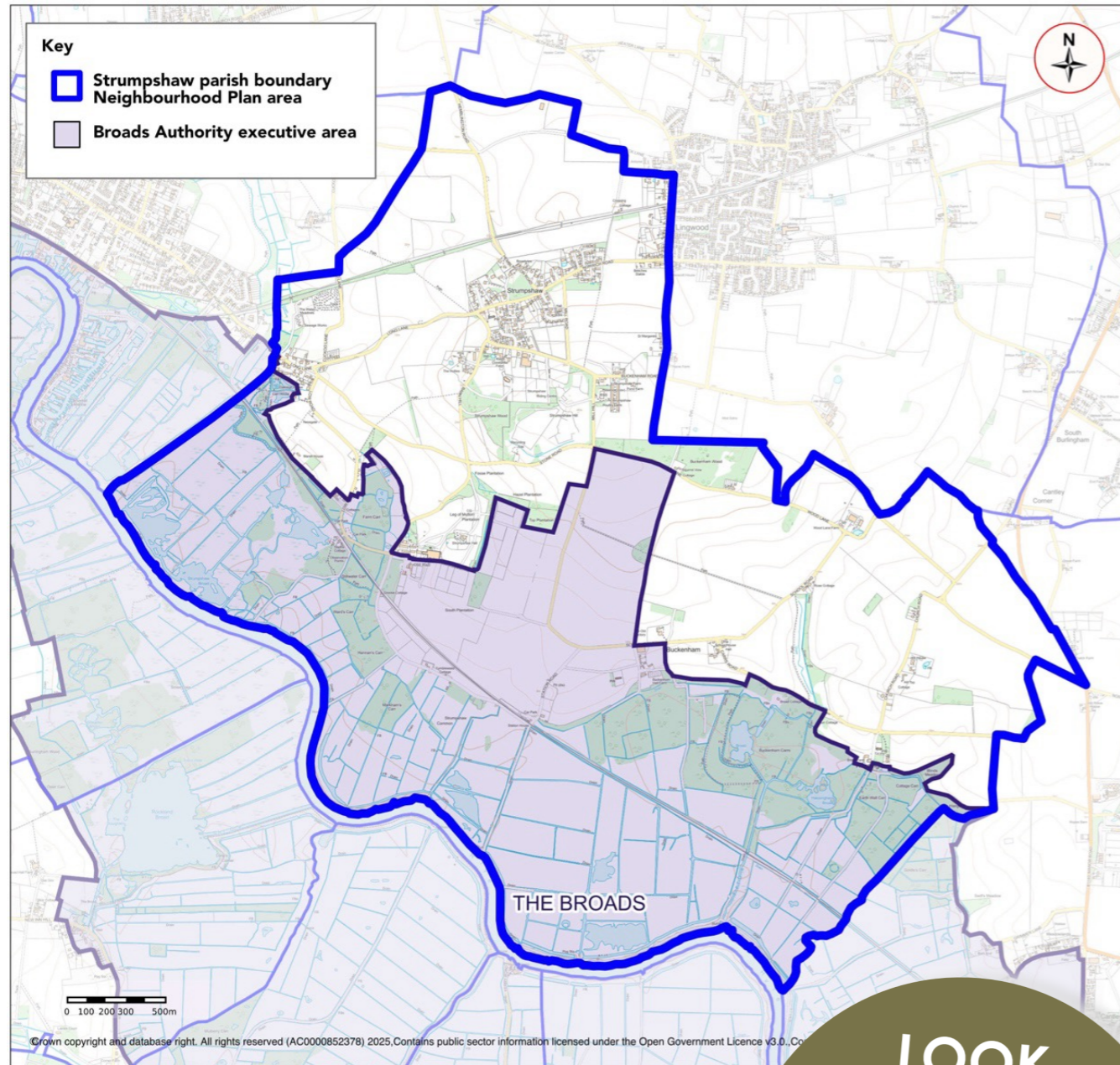

The revised Strumpshaw Neighbourhood Plan is a planning policy document written by the community to guide future development in the parish until 2045.

Once the new Neighbourhood Plan is 'made', it will form part of the Local Plans for Broadland and the Broads Authority. They will use it to help to determine planning applications. Strumpshaw Parish Council will also use the Neighbourhood Plan to respond to planning applications.

ACCESS

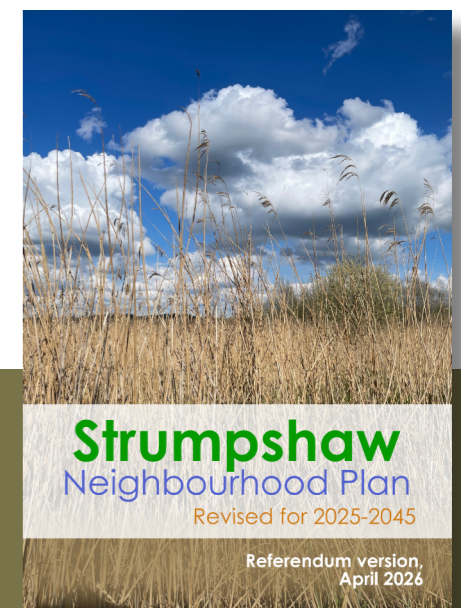
- STR11: Highway safety

- STR6: Ecological corridors
- STR7: Local Green Spaces
- STR8: Important local views
- STR9: Dark skies
- STR10: Localised surface water flooding and sewage management

COMMUNITY

- STR13: Existing and new community infrastructure
- STR14: Former landfill site
