

## **Broadland District Councillor Report for Strumpshaw Parish Council – 17 March 2026**

The BDC Customer Experience Project continues to progress, and an update was provided to the Overview and Scrutiny committee on 20 January. The project aims to improve customer service, modernise service delivery and reduce operational costs through a new digital platform. The procurement exercise has been completed, and the new service is being developed. It is expected the service will be in use by the end of March 2026.

The finalists for the 2026 Broadland and South Norfolk Business Awards have been announced. The winners will be revealed at an awards evening on the 18 March. The categories include Business Growth, Business Innovation, Employer of the Year, Environmental Impact, Food and Drink producer of the Year, Insurance Financial or Professional Services, Manufacturing and Engineering Business of the Year, New Business, Small Business, Tourism, Pub of the Year, Retailer of the Year, and Business Builder exemplar. Elections to Norfolk County Council seats will be held on 7 May 2026. The next elections for the principal authorities in Norfolk are expected in May 2027 for Councillors to sit on the Shadow Unitary Authorities. The Structural Change Order (SCO) creates the legislation needed to form the Shadow Authorities and is expected in Autumn 2026. One matter in the SCO is the Schedule of Elections, and Broadland DC is asking for the shadow authority elections to be at the same time as the town/parish elections in 2027 in order to simplify and streamline the process and reduce election costs. The government decision on the number of unitary authorities is expected to be announced on or before 25 March 2026. The aim is to get this announcement out in Norfolk and Suffolk before the pre-election period. The result will then lead to the formation of the structure of the new Mayoral Combined

Authority. When the Shadow Authorities come in there will be a Section 24 notice enacted to control what the existing authorities can do.

The United Nations has declared 2026 as the International Year of the Volunteer. There is a drive across the County to promote this and host a festival of volunteering in June 2026. The Greater Norwich authorities (Broadland District Council, Norwich City Council and South Norfolk Council, working with Norfolk County Council) are preparing to review the Greater Norwich Local Plan which was adopted in March 2024. The review is prompted by national planning reform and the government's new method for calculating housing need. In addition, the government has introduced a new plan-making system, which changes the way local plans are prepared. As part of the early preparation stage of reviewing the GNLP, the Greater Norwich authorities have opened a Call for Sites. Landowners, developers, and other interested parties have been invited to submit sites that may be suitable for housing, employment or other uses. The Greater Norwich authorities will then assess submissions to identify which sites may be suitable to allocate in the reviewed local plan. This will form the basis of a future public consultation. BDC has increased its stock of temporary accommodation. This is saving the council money as temporary accommodation provides income from rent as well as reducing bills for bed and breakfast accommodation. The council has 53 temporary accommodation units with more coming online in March 2026.

Cllr Davis has funded repairs and improvements to the community telephone box in Postwick using his members ward grant. The box is used as a community library offering books, puzzles and games to residents of all ages.

Cllr Davis has assisted with provision of signage to deter fly tipping which has been an issue in Postwick on Ferry Lane and Oaks Lane.

BDC has been recognised as Large Employer of the Year for its apprenticeship programme. It celebrated and supported National Apprenticeship Week 2026 by interviewing some of the apprentices at BDC and SNC who explained how their skills have developed and their careers have been shaped. **At BDC Main Council on 19 February 2026 the following were approved:**

The Revenue Budget for 2026/27 was agreed. There will be no rise in Council Tax and Broadland is one of the very few councils who are not raising tax in the coming financial year.

**The Band D level of Council Tax is to remain at the same level as it was in 2024/2025 and 2025/26 which is £134.91 for General Expenditure. The Band D level of Council Tax is lower than it was last year at £0.83 for Special Expenditure.**

The Capital Strategy and Capital Programme for 2026/27 to 2030/31 were approved. The total cost of the 5-year capital programme comes to just over £15m and will be continually reviewed to ensure the council obtains value for money.

The Treasury Management Strategy Statement 2026/27 was approved.

BDC approved an updated Safeguarding Policy. This follows a full review of the current safeguarding arrangements and an update in procedures. The updated safeguarding policy will be published on the BDC website.

BDC approved a new policy for Waste Services. This reflects current and upcoming legislation in relation to the government's waste and recycling reforms and sets clear service standards for the district. Councils now need to consider the introduction of Packaging Extended Producer Responsibility payments and Simpler Recycling measures. Clear standards are set out for contamination, side waste, container provision and assisted collections.

The Greater Norwich 5-year Infrastructure Investment Plan 2026-2031 and the Annual Growth Programme 2026/27 were approved. The projects funded by the pooled Community Infrastructure Levy in Broadland are:

The Blofield Park Community Centre £500,000

The Nest Padel courts project £150,000

BDC agreed to approve and adopt the new Council Delivery Plan 2026 to 2028 which supports the Council Plan 2024 to 2028. The two-year delivery plan gives detail on the project that BDC will deliver to achieve its vision and priorities and runs from April 2026.

BDC agreed to establish two planning related working groups. These include an Enforcement Oversight board and a Development Management Review panel.

BDC agreed to adopt the Rackheath Neighbourhood Plan (Revised for 2024/25) with the examiner's modifications. The plan can be viewed here:

BDC agreed to adopt an updated Anti-Fraud and Anti-Corruption strategy which was last approved in 2023. The Strategy sets out the approach to minimise the risk of fraud and corruption occurring, and the actions it will take if fraudulent activity is suspected and identified.

Cllr Davis attended a meeting at the end of February at Lingwood Village Hall which gave an update on the current progress of the A47 dualling project and upcoming planned works including the installation of new bridge structures.

Broadland District Council's community Annual Big Litter Pick is now open. Community groups, schools and businesses can take part between now and 31 May. All registered groups will receive £50 for taking part and helping to keep the district clean, and 10 participating groups will have the chance to receive £250 to reinvest in their community. Cantley, Limpenhoe and Southwood Parish Council has made an application to BDC to designate a Neighbourhood area for the purposes of developing a Neighbourhood Plan and this has now been approved.

The BDC Dog Warden Service has received the RSPCA Gold Paw Print Award for their service provision for the fourth consecutive year. This recognises excellence in the stray dog service provided by the council

The BDC Handy Person Service won **National Handy Person Service of the Year** at the Healthy Housing Awards. The service operates across South Norfolk and Broadland and provides minor repairs, falls prevention equipment, safety fittings and domestic abuse sanctuary scheme support for residents.

On 11 March BDC hosted a Business Breakfast for over 100 business owners. BDC is committed to supporting local enterprises in the district. Since the launch of the Business Builder programme in 2022 it has supported 472 businesses and awarded £2.3m in grants.

A new Let's Go! Visitor economy initiative will launch in Summer 2026. This will showcase beautiful walking routes across the districts and highlight nearby independent businesses to boost visitor numbers and tourism.

13 community led environmental projects across Broadland have been awarded funding through the BDC Future for Nature Fund, with additional support from some Section 106 developer contributions taking the total investment to over £60,000. The fund supports a wide range of initiatives designed to restore natural habitats, capture carbon and improve public access to green spaces, empowering communities to play an active role in protecting and enhancing the district's natural environment.

Congratulations to all those awarded grants in Brundall Ward which include:

**Brundall Parish Council** - awarded a grant of £5000 to create a pond at the Countryside Park

**Cantley Parish Council** - awarded a grant of £4700 to restore an existing pond forming part of a circular walking route.

**Strumpshaw Parish Council** - awarded a grant of £3440 to create a 2km circular walk around Buckenham Woods
